Summary of KEY Regulations



CLEAN AIR ACT:

Authorizes the EPA to establish air pollution regulations. Air Quality standards are determined by the EPA and regulated through State Implementation Plans.

SUPERFUND OR CERCLA:

Establishes a federal and state program for clean up of hazardous waste sites. Potentially responsible parties include transporters, site owners, operators and waste generators.

RESOURCE CONSERVATION AND RECOVERY ACT:

Wastes are considered hazardous based on characteristics of reactivity, corrosivity, toxicity and/or ignitability. This act regulates the disposal, storage, treatment and generation of hazardous waste.

CLEAN AIR ACT:

Sets goals through permit programs for direct discharge into natural waters, storm water runoffs, accidental oil discharge, wetlands and pre-treated discharge to publicly owned works programs.
